About the book

This suspenseful upper-middle-grade novel tells a story of culture and community in a gripping mystery plot.

Tia Lugo has a deadly secret.

Tia Lugo considers herself an ordinary thirteen-year-old girl. She just wants to enjoy the end of summer, which means hanging out with her best friend and neighbor, Julius, and ignoring her Puerto Rican grandmother's embarrassing reliance on creepy candles, weird-smelling herb bundles, and eerie statues—all available for sale at the nearby botanica. But when Tia witnesses a murder late one night from her bedroom window, everything changes in an instant.

Now, Tia is terrified to tell anyone what she's seen. What if the killer comes after her too? He knows where she lives. Even worse, Tia believes he's sending her secret messages, reminding her to stay quiet. Desperate to keep herself and her family safe, Tia turns to the last place she ever thought she'd go: her grandmother's favorite shopping spot, the botanica.

Two Options:

- *Book Discussion Questions*: These are big, broad questions that work best after the complete book has been read. These questions can be adapted for book clubs, reading journals, reading workshop class, library groups, or more.
- Chapter Comprehension Questions: For those reading the book chapter by chapter with a class.

Book Discussion Questions:

- **2.** Do you think Tia's relationship with her parents influences how she makes decisions? Why or why not?
- **3.** Compare and contrast Tia and Julius using examples from the text. Which character do you relate to more?
- **4.** Describe how Gram knows that Tia is struggling with a problem.
- **5.** Why is Tia embarrassed by Gram's beliefs? How do you know?
- **6.** What adjectives would you use to describe Tia's community and why?
- 7. What is the theme of this novel? Use evidence from the text to support your answer.
- 8. Does Tia change throughout the story? In what ways does she change?
- 9. If you were to pick an alternate title for this novel, what would it be?
- 10. Why do you think Tia breaks the monkey statue? Would you do the same?
- **11.** Pick a character from the book other than Tia. How would this story be different if the book were written from their perspective?

Why do you think it's so easy for Tia to talk to Mr. Butler?

Tia thought Mr. Butler was upset because he thought she was snooping. Why do you think he grew so serious?

Tia wants to clear things up with Mr. Butler. What would be the best way for her to do that?

Chapter 25

On page 176 it says, "... I listened as a stranger treaded around my living room like he belonged there. Like we were in his house and not mine." Based on this passage, choose an adjective that best describes the stranger.

On page 177 Tia thinks about things she could have done to stay safe. She says, "If only I had listened to Julius and called Detective Erickson. If only I had stayed away from my window that night." In your opinion, what else could Tia have done to stay safe? Add another "if only."

What does Tia mean when she says her asthma "kicked up a few notches?"

Chapter 28

Based on what Detective Erickson learns about Jonathan, and the notes left at the memorial, what kind of person do you think Jonathan was?

Some of the neighborhood women referred to Mrs. Perez as a know-it-all. How would you describe her?

In Julius's note to Tia, he says he wants to learn everything she learns while at camp. What types of things do you think Tia will learn there?

What are some other things Tia might add to her memento box? What would you add to yours?

Bonus Questions:

If you were to rename Sweet Potato, what would it be?

Tia's favorite holiday is Halloween. Do you have one too? Why is it your favorite?

Gram can tell when something isn't right just by looking at someone. Have you ever experienced this? When?





Tia's neighbors all seem to know each other. Is your community the same or different from Tia's? Tia's family enjoys traditional food based on her culture. What type of food do you enjoy?

Essay Ideas:

- 1. Pick your favorite character and your favorite scene. Then re-write the scene based on that character's point of view.
- 2. Pretend you're a news reporter at the scene when Mr. Butler slips on the soapy water and appears to be "trying to swim away." Write an article describing the scene. Make it funny, serious, or both! It's up to you. Remember to use all your senses. This helps your readers to imagine the story you're trying to tell.
- **3.** If magic potions were real, what kind would you want? Write a short story based on the potion.
